

• Nancy Johnson reported on the Botanic garden's latest activities, including the new electric boat on Lake Cachuma, to be used as a floating classroom. As for the

proposed CUP, the Garden's Board of Trustees will be conducting a retreat on May 20<sup>th</sup>, and will be discussing that CUP in the course thereof. Ms. Johnson says County Planning is indicating some desire for a decision by the Garden as to whether/how the CUP will be pursued.

- Today the Board of Supervisors conducted further public hearings on the Questa Report, and the proposed responses by Environmental Health to that Report. Our own Board will request a meeting with Rick Merrifield, to review EHS' recommendations and possible courses of action.
